Gopalakrishnan, Director, Tata Sons Ltd., Mumbai could not attend the meeting due to their prior commitment and they were granted leave of absence.

At the outset, the Chairman Board of Governors welcomed all the members and the special invitee to the 22nd meeting of the Board of Governors. The Chairman introduced to the Board that he has come from industry background particularly with pharmaceutical industry. He has lot of academic interest as he is closely associated with IISER, IIMs and IIT system. In addition to the above, he is associated with Ahmedabad University, Nurshi Muniji University and several other private Universities in the country as Chairperson, Governing Council or Board of Management. The Chairman mentioned that it is his pleasure to work with all in the Institute.

The Chairman highlighted MHRD's initiative on the ranking system of IITs, IIMs, Central Universities and other institutions. He mentioned that it is only the beginning and we can go up for which we have to work as a team. The Chairman told the members that he is sure the Institute will rank better in future. He expressed his satisfaction that the Institute campus is getting ready so that the faculty and the students can work better in the permanent campus. The Institute requires additional grant to create infrastructure and the Ministry of HRD representative informed during the 21st meeting of the Finance Committee that the Revised Cost Estimate of IIT Bhubaneswar Project has been worked out to the tune of Rs.1880 crore which is expected to be considered by the Cabinet soon. The Ministry is planning to release Rs.140 crore to the Institute within 10 days which includes both revenue and capital expenditure. The Chairman expressed his confidence that this financial support from the Ministry will help the Institute in creating necessary infrastructure and create an environment for faster development in teaching and research. The Chairman was hopeful to have more participative and meaningful meetings in the larger interest of the Institute.

Prof. R V Raja Kumar, Director of the Institute thanked Shri Pankaj Ramanbhai Patel for his acceptance as Chairman Board of Governors of the Institute. The Director stated that the Institute will move forward under the dynamic leadership of the Chairman to achieve academic excellence in the years to come.

The Board of Governors considered the recommendations of the Selection Committee for appointment of Student Counsellor and resolved that the same be approved.

BoG:22-7 To consider and approve the infrastructure requirements for the growth of the Institute over the next five years along with budget estimate for realising the objectives.

The Board of Governors considered the Perspective Plan submitted by the Institute along with the infrastructure requirements for the growth of the Institute over the next five years 2016-2017 to 2021-2022 vis-à-vis the budget requirements.

MHRD sanctioned Rs.760 crore to each of the 8 new IITs established in 2008. Accordingly, out of this 760 crore a sum of Rs.529 crore was earmarked for construction and equipment (388 + 141 = 529). The remaining 231 crore was meant for recurring expenditure both salary and non-salary components. The Project duration was six years initially but this was subsequently made eight years by the MHRD.

As per the DPR Rs.388 crore was earmarked for creating an infrastructure of 2,21,000 sqm which includes 63,000 sqm area under Academic Complex and the remaining 158000 sqm area under residential complex for an estimated student strength of 2360 by the end of the project period of 8 years.

The Institute has released Rs.337 crore so far to CPWD and they also sent a letter to the Institute for a release Rs.60 crore more to settle pending bills. CPWD was requested to provide building/project wise expenditure details such as estimate, award value, actual expenditure and justification for extra expenditure but the details submitted by CPWD are incomplete.

Out of 221000 sqm infrastructure planned the Institute could get only102587 sqm with the available grant of Rs.388 crore which is less than 50% of the original plan. The infrastructure shortfall is 118413 sqm. The student strength should have been 2360 by now but the student strength as on date is 1050 which is also less than 50% of the plan. The Institute has to fill up the gap in terms of infrastructure and therefore, a Perspective Plan for the growth of the Institute for the next 5 years is placed before the Finance Committee for its consideration. The student strength will be increased to 4500 by the end of 2022.

The perspective plan proposes that the built space be raised to 2,72,957 sqm by 2021-22. At present, the built space stands at 1,02,587 sqm as against the

2,21,000 sqm planned in the original DPR whose period ended in March 2016. That is, effectively, the perspective plan proposes to create a built space of 51,570 sqm (by 2021-22), over what was projected in the DPR, by March 2016.

The average annual fund requirement is Rs.483.07 crore.

The MHRD representative informed during the 21st meeting of the FC that the Revised Cost Estimate (RCE) of IIT Bhubaneswar project has been worked out to the tune of Rs.1880 crore which is expected to be approved by the Cabinet soon.

On the built space planning, the representative for IFD, MHRD vide letter No.1-5/2013-IFD dated 19.04.2016 reminded that the scope for space as per the original DPR is 2,21,000 sqm (the original time frame of this DPR has ended in March 2016) and advised that this requirement be fulfilled in the first instance and that the Institute can thereafter take up the rest as per the proposed Perspective Plan with financial support from Government.

The Board of Governors resolved that the Perspective Plan for the growth of the Institute for the next five years from 2016-2017 to 2021-2022 with a budget estimate Rs.2415.35 crore be approved for seeking MHRD grant to achieve the objectives of the Institute stated in the Perspective Plan.

a) To consider appointment of Project Management Consultant (PMC) on nomination basis as communicated by MHRD vide its letter No. F.N.46-5/2008-TS.I dated 10th February 2016 and F.No.14-12/2013-TS.I dated 30th November 2015 following the provisions given under Rule 126 of GFR 2005 issued by the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure vide OM No. 15(1)/E-II (A) / 2010 dated 20th August 2010. MHRD, further, reiterates that the matter regarding appointment of Project Management Consultant for construction activities of the Institute comes under the purview of Board of Governors.

- b) to consider the report submitted by Prof. G. C. Mitra Committee to appoint a Project Management Consultant on nomination basis by the Institute in the light of the MHRD Letter No. F.N.46-5/2008-TS.I dated 10th February 2016 and F.No.14-12/2013-TS.I dated 30th November 2015 and Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure vide OM No. 15(1)/E-II (A) / 2010 dated 20th August 2010
- c) to consider the legal opinion given by Shri Anup Kumar Bose, Assistant Solicitor General of India (ASGI) on engagement of a Project Management Consultant. Shri Bose opines that NBCC is a Government of India undertaking and as per the settled principle in this regard there is no impediment in providing the work through a limited bid among the PSUs and there is no legal bar in adopting such procedure. There is no illegality in the process of selection and engagement of PMC in the manner as adopted by the Institute. He is of the opinion that there is nothing on record to show that appointment of NBCC on nomination basis violates any CVC guidelines.

The Board also considered the following while appointing NBCC as PMC:

- Recommendations of Prof. V. S. Raju Committee so far as PMC's experience, expertise and past performance in Project Management of Educational/Institutional buildings, libraries, laboratories etc. are concerned while shortlisting Project Management Consultants.
- 2. Lump sum service charges to be claimed by PMCs for execution of work.
- 3. The Institute has not violated any CVC guidelines in the process of appointing a PMC as per the legal opinion given by Shri Anup Bose, Assistant Solicitor General of India.
- 4. The resolutions/observations of the Board of Governors made at its 17th meeting held on 4th May 2015 (BoG: Agenda 17-5) and 18th meeting held on 10th July 2015 (BoG: Agenda 18-13) to the following effect:
 - i) No extension beyond 16th August 2015 shall be allowed to CPWD.

- ii) If the need arises, CPWD be asked to handover the buildings to the Institute on "as is and where is basis".
- iii) No further work will be awarded to CPWD.
- iv) The Board of Governors in its 21st meeting held on 19.01.2016 concurred with the earlier resolution made in its 17th and 18th meetings and resolved that no new work be given to CPWD vide item No.21-4(a)
- 5. Observations of Prof. G. C. Mitra Committee on the invitation of all the four major agencies /PSUs by the Institute to provide Project Management Services was done as per the decisions of the BoG that no new work can be assigned to CPWD (vide agenda 17-5 and 21-4). Accordingly, the Institute invited (i) RITES (ii) EPIL (iii) NBCC and (iv) Bridge & Roof to make presentation of their credentials before Prof. V S Raju Committee and offer their bids for consideration. Prof. Raju Committee after having considered their presentation and other credentials ranked the PSUs in order of merit for their suitability for executing Institute works.

 - 3. RITES

(The offer of EPIL was not competitive according to Prof. Raju Committee)

6. Recommendations of the 19th meeting of the Finance Committee held on 19.12.2015 wherein the Finance Committee recommended to the BoG the appointment of NBCC as Project Management Consultant (PMC) to the Institute for executing civil and other related works.

The Board of Governors, after having considered the proposal submitted by the Institute on appointment of PMC, resolved that NBCC be appointed Project Management Consultant (PMC) of the Institute. The Board further resolved that a team of experienced engineers be appointed by the Institute on contract basis or employ a third party monitoring agency in order to monitor and ensure quality of construction by NBCC from the date of commencement of the project. Continuous supervision and inspection from the Institute side be ensured so that NBCC delivers quality construction and also completion of buildings on time.

The Board resolved that necessary formalities be completed including signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Project

	Management Consultant (PMC) so that the construction activities can commence at the earliest.

The above revision of tuition fee was communicated by MHRD to all IITs vide its F.No. 24-2/2016 TS 1 dated 08th April 2016.
